



Bowls NZ Coach Accreditation Process

Completion requirements

- Attendance at a two day course that will cover both coaching principles and sport specific content
- Practical coaching (20 hours) with mentor coach providing guidance
- Assessment – theory
 - Competence will be assessed with the completion of the questions in the workbook either in writing or orally
- Assessment - practical
 - An assessor will observe the coach and provide feedback based on the checklist (page 19 in workbook)

Coaches will be expected to demonstrate that:

- ✓ They adhere to the method of teaching technique as set out in the manual
 - ✓ They have a sound understanding of the required technique for delivery, line taking and bowl speed adjustment
 - ✓ They communicate in a positive manner
 - ✓ They can analyze common faults and discuss correction options
 - ✓ They can successfully plan and deliver a coaching session

- It is also recommended that coaches at this level obtain a First Aid Certificate

The process for Accreditation as a Bowls NZ Coach will be detailed at the course.

The course will be held at Burnside Bowling Club (Sunday 6th and Saturday 12th May 2012 9.30 – 4.30pm) . Tea and coffee will be provided. Please bring your lunch, bowls and flat soled shoes.
