### **Match Committee news**

With the season recently opening, it seems timely for an update on the Men's Club Championships. Bowls Canterbury have once again added constraints to the seasons play by placing events on many of the weekend dates and by moving many of the Champion of Champion events forward in the bowls calendar. With the above in mind and following feedback from players last season, there have been a number of changes to this year's Club Championships which we would now like to share.

Men's club 4s, section play has been reduced to 4 rounds. Top 8 teams will qualify for post section. All rounds Including post section have schedule dates of play in the Programme.

Men's Club Triples have been moved till after Christmas following feedback and section play reduced to 4 rounds. Top 8 teams qualify for post section. All rounds including post section have scheduled dates of

play in the Programme. The Triples schedule remains very tight and there will be no allowance for delayed play. Players are asked to consider their availability carefully before entering.

The decision was made to avoid scheduled play on Canterbury show weekend and allow the players the chance of a long weekend with family and friends. There is however an exception to this and that is the requirement to have completed the required rounds of Men's Singles and pairs matches if you are entered in these events. eg this weekend is reserved for catch up play for anyone requiring it.

Another change from Bowls Canterbury is that under 8s has been revised back to being an under 5s competition. This means the under 8 singles has changed to under 5s singles as it leads to a Champion of Champion event. Please note the under 8 years 2x4x2 event will remain as it is a club only competition.

With Bowls Canterbury moving the Champion of Champions forward, we have decided to run the Handicap Singles and Pairs later in the seasons after other championship play has concluded. The Handicap pairs will also be played over weekends with the hope being able to increase entries in these events and give the opportunity for play later in the season.

With the changes made by Bowls Canterbury and more Centre play also falling on week nights, the bowling schedule is tighter than ever. Players are asked to keep on top of their required games and to be forthcoming with legitimate extension requests. If you are holding up play without an approved extension, you can expect to be defaulted so as to not disadvantage others.

Lastly, the Match committee supports club members rights to enter club championships regardless of their availability for Champion of Champion events. However the club is keen to have Burnside represented at such Champion of Champion events, with this in mind, should you find yourself progressing through to a final for which you will be unavailable for the Champion of Champions event if you win, you are asked to contact the match committee prior to playing that final. ## Umpire's corner

Answer Question Corner (i)

Hamish Wilson - 0273334070

- a) As a marker you must intervene. (Law 42.2.2)
- b) Make sure that the jack has been centred, having made sure that the mat has been centred. Check that the mat line is not less than 2 metres from the rear ditch and not less than 25 metres from the front ditch (Law 6.1.1)

Measure the distance from the centre of the mat line to the nearest point of the jack – if it is less than 23 metres it is not in line with the laws after being centred – an improperly delivered jack. (Law 10.1.3)

Umpires carry a long tape measure for this situation.

Question Corner (ii)

What happens if a player displaces the jack when it is at rest – either on the green or in the ditch?
