1-00 pm Opening Ceremony – please gather around Laing Green (remember spacing) - Welcome to the season, flag raised, first bowl played

#### 1-15 pm New Season Tournament

Festival Bowls Format – mixed; 2-bowl triples, 3 games each of 6 ends; leads and skips only to handle jacks and mats. Seconds and skips to keep the scoreboards.

Dress Code: Club uniform for those who have it but mufti is fine for players new to the Club. This competition is suitable for all Club members.

# **Umpire's Corner**

#### Question (LXVII)

A player decides to play a short bowl as a 'blocker'. It finishes very short of the head but still within the boundaries of the rink. The opposing skip calls for an umpire. What should the umpire's procedure be?

#### **Answer**

The umpire should measure, in a straight line, the distance from the centre of the mat line to the nearest part of the bowl. If it is less than 14 metres the bowl should be declared dead. (Law 17.1.3)

### Question (LXVIII)

A jack, in its original course, is deflected by a member of the team which delivered the jack. What should happen?
