# **U26 Singles tournament**

#### Summary ...

With some notable past winners no longer eligible for play and several ruled out by COVID travel restrictions, the Burnside U26 Singles remained anyone's for the taking as 32 of the country's top young talents converged in Christchurch.

Taking his opportunity to build on last year's semi-finals loss, the former national secondary school champion and Bay of Plenty intercentre representative Anthony Ouellet was in fine touch to secure the silverware and round out a memorable win opposite host club favourite Richard Hocking.

In fact, such was the form of Ouellet, the 20-year-old put a stop to Hocking's perfect record, handing the Burnside player his only defeat of the event following a nine-game unbeaten streak through to the final. After seven games of section play, the top eight emerged with the top two qualifiers in each section advancing through to the main event. Section qualifiers comprised James Collier (Rangiora), Jesse Russell (Cambridge Central), Aidan Zittersteijn (Paritutu), Bradley Down (Plimmerton), Seamus Curtin (Stokes Valley), Jonty Horwell (Kaikorai), along with Hocking and Ouellet.

The final saw both form players trading shots throughout, with the scores locked at 16-a piece in the race to 21. A clinical finish saw Ouellet claim a single shot on the 19<sup>th</sup> end, before closing the match out with a full count to claim the 2021 title, 21-16.

Commenting on the win, Ouellet described his efforts as consistent, putting on a strong performance throughout the weekend.

"It felt like a dream getting a four to finish such a close and great final against Richard. This tournament is always a highlight of the season and to win it is an honour considering some of the names that are on that trophy," he beamed.

"If you're playing consistently then you'll usually do well, so overall I'm pleased with my performance. In singles, it's always important to take your time and capitalise on the opportunities."

The win saw Ouellet pocket the \$1000 winners' cheque, with Hocking collecting \$500 for runner-up and the beaten semi-finalists, \$300. In earlier post-section fixtures, Hocking defeated Russell 21-11, while Ouellet won a thrilling hitout opposite Curtin, 21-15.

In other results, last year's winner Taylor Horn fell at the final hurdle in Division 2, with Marlborough's Chase Bishop coasting to a 21-7 victory, Dunedin's Keanu Darby edging a close fixture opposite South Canterbury's Tom Taiaroa in Division 3 and Kaikorai's Mitchell Scott defeating Woolston Park's Dylan Campbell to round out Division 4. Ouellet will now turn his attention to representative commitments with the Bay of Plenty, before gearing up for what he hopes will be another promising showing at the Summerset National Singles and Pairs in Christchurch in January.

The skips should toss a coin to decide. The winner of the toss can choose whether to place the mat and deliver the jack and the first bowl or tell the opposition to place the mat and deliver the jack and the first bowl. (Law 28.2)

This date is the Saturday of Labour Day weekend. The Hayman Trophy Drawing Competition will replace the Orchard Trophy which will be held on a later date. The reason for this is that the Hayman Trophy (postponed on September 18), is traditionally played before interclub starts (it begins on 30 October). It is great and enforced practice for players of all abilities, it is enjoyable and your main opponent is yourself. **Starting time for this event is 1-00 pm. Apologies to those who are playing in other events.**

Dress code is Club Uniform. There is no entry fee for this event – the prize is the trophy. Winner takes all! There may however be some spot prizes.

The Hayman Trophy is one of Burnside's earliest trophies - first played for in 1965. The event is a drawing competition and the names engraved on the Trophy include a who's who of Burnside's most accomplished draw players. Originally this was a men's only event but from 1998, with amalgamation, all club members are eligible to enter.

Stella Trower and Jo Edwards won this trophy in 2006 and 2008 respectively while several others of our women members have achieved top five placings. The beauty of this event is that even though you are competing against the whole field your main competitor is yourself! Whether you score 7 or 107 this is an enjoyable event where each bowl has the potential to score you points. This is great practice for young and old, new and experienced players. No matter what you eventually score the Hayman Trophy competition will help you improve your bowls!

#### The Rules are Simple

3 or 4 players per rink

4 bowls per player

18 or 21 ends (depends on the conditions)

Each rink will be marked with a cross at medium, short and long lengths

Each end players draw their four bowls first to a medium, then short and then long jack in that sequence – think MSL (Medium, Sea, Level)

Points are scored 1 point within 1 yard of the jack, 2 points within 2 feet, and 3 points within a foot.

Each rink will have at least one player experienced in this format to guide your group.

Any fine details and any questions will be explained and answered on the day.

There's no need to learn these rules off by heart this week. They will be repeated next week.
