## Umpires Corner

Question Corner (iii)

A player plays out of turn. The player's bowl does not touch anything during its course. The bowl comes to rest 2 metres from the jack. What should happen?

Answer:

The bowl has not disturbed the head so the opponent should choose whether to leave the head as it is and play two bowls one after the other to get back to the proper order of play or return the bowl and get back to the proper order of play. Law 29.1.2

Question Corner (iv)

The lead in team A delivers the jack which comes to rest in the front ditch. The lead in team B then delivers the jack which comes to rest less than the minimum distance from the mat line. What happens next?

### **The Rules are Simple**

3 players per rink

4 bowls per player

18 or 21 ends (depends on the conditions)

Each rink will be marked with a cross at the medium, short and long length

Players draw their four bowls first to a medium, then short and then long jack in that sequence.

Points are scored 1 point within 1 yard of the jack, 2 points within 2 feet, and 3 points within a foot.

Each rink will have at least one player experienced in this format to guide your group.

Any fine details and any questions will be explained and answered on the day.

**AND THAT'S ALL THERE IS TO IT!**

Now all we need is your entry to give this event the prestige it warrants.

You can enter by putting your name on the entry lists in the match rooms or online.

**WHEN YOU DO YOU ARE IN** - just turn up 15 minutes before start time on Saturday. You will be allocated a playing rink for the afternoon and this will be posted on the match rooms' boards on the day.
